
August 23rd | 4-6PM


August 24th | 3-5PM

Crowds form and people dance whenever the band takes the stage as they are drawn in by the pleasing sounds of the marimbas, the syncopated rhythms, the diverse repertoire of music ranging from original funky grooves to deep traditional African melodies to British Pop covers, and the obvious fun that these young men are having on stage.
